

## **RE: STAGE II - DROUGHT CONTINGENCY WEEKLY UPDATE**

CURRENT LAKE LEVEL: WATER LEVEL 860.36 Feet MSL

Friday, April 14, 2023 at 5:15:00 AM Level is **6.64 feet below** the conservation pool of 867.00 feet MSL



Watershed area for Lake Palo Pinto remains in a **MODERATE DROUGHT** 

**<u>CONSUMPTION DEMAND</u>**: Water use **increased 4** % when compared to last week. A portion of this increase was attributable to major water leaks (Mineral Wells: SW 1<sup>st</sup> ST, Mineral Wells: E. US 180, and Millsap WSC: UNK location). The system also performed the TCEQ required monthly water quality testing. STAGE II Goal is a 25% reduction in demand.

**WEATHER FORECAST:** The 7-day outlook for the Lake Palo Pinto watershed area indicates a chance (about 35%) of isolated thunderstorms next Tuesday (04/18). No other rainfall is expected in the watershed area in the coming week.

**SITUATION REPORT:** With the level of Lake Palo Pinto continuing to fall (down 2.04 inches since last week), **STAGE II Drought Conditions/Restrictions remain in effect**. Commercial and Industrical exemptions are being evaluated on a case-by-case basis relative to a written plan and "business necessity". Many customers are utilizing effluent reuse water from Pollard WWTP for their outdoor watering needs. Enforcement of outdoor watering violations has begun. Reminder: <u>It will be necessary to implement STAGE III Restrictions if</u> Lake Palo Pinto level drops **below 857 Feet MSL**.
