

STAGE II requires a 25% reduction in consumption.


CURRENT LAKE LEVEL: WATER LEVEL 857.38 Friday, March 1, 2024 at 8: 15: 00 AM Level is 9.62 feet below the conservation pool of 867.00 feet MSL Lake Palo Pinto: 35.4% full as of 2024-03-01 Dead Pool Conservation Pool Flood Pool



<u>CONSUMPTION DEMAND</u>: Consumption demand decreased (-25%) when compared to last week. One major leak was recorded (250k loss) at Ft. Wolters after a fire hydrant's seat ring seal failed and had to be replaced. No other significant losses or service interruptions were reported this period. HWTP production for this week averaged 2.65 MGD.


WEATHER FORECAST: The weekend looks to be sunny, with highs in the low 80's. Next week has increasing chances for scattered showers in the watershed, with next Thursday the most likely day to receive widespread coverage and a chance for thunderstorms in the area. February 2024 closed out with 0.95 inches of rain for the month compared with an average rainfall of 1.51 inches or ½ inch below normal.

SITUATION REPORT: The lake level fell (0.06 feet MSL) to close out this week's period. This level was improved after .22 inches of rain was recorded in the watershed yesterday. The release valve at Lake Palo Pinto remains open (7cfs) while levels at the Diversion Pool (-14") and Pre-Sed (-14.25") are being monitored and maintained. One blending pump (1.2MGD) @ Brazos is running.
